Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): Lamb trade in keeping with that of the national average with trade slightly easier following larger shows and less demand. Heavier and best bred types best to sell with export and lighter weights showing the biggest reductions. Commercial export lambs 185p-195p with nicer types still over 200p a kilo. Best bred lambs 220p-270p topping at 276.3p from J & A Lawson & Son who also sold lambs to 269.7p and 253.8p. A nice run of lambs from Richard and Carol Benson peaked at 246.3p with MB Townley's best pens to 246.3p. Heavy lambs either side of £90 with some nicer sorts £95-£107. A few pens of Mules forward sold to 171.4p or £82 per head. Lightweight lambs around 180p-190p with some better pens 200p-207p.
