Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): Calf pens full again this week, with quality in abundance too. A good show of blue heifers, with more farmer buyers looking for future cow makers. Best coming from the Whitakers of Winmarleigh with a dark weaned heifer at £440, a younger milky calf from Robin Boothman peaking at £430. Tom Stables also over £400, with his strong white heifer at £415, others regularly £330-£390. Once again best continental bulls up over £400, with the top rate sorts at £430 twice, again from Tom Stables and Dave Martin, a trio from Henry Knowles at £440, £445, £450 whilst the Wallbanks topped the Blue bulls at £455. Angus bulls just as good to sell, the strongest again from regular sale topper John Lawson, Bentham with calves at £360, £380 & £385 x2, other milky sorts £250-£280. Heifers a touch sharper with most £175-£220, topping at £230. A few young Jersey bred calves looking well sold at £120-£130. Wyn Hull realised the grass isn't always greener on the other side and returned to Bentham with a nice group of weaned calves, his best, a Charollais bull at 3months at £510. Black and white numbers tight, with plenty of demand. A good run of strong calves all around 10 weeks from The Stables at Bolton Manor peaked at £212, with others £180-£198. Milky calves £75-£105, with the next draw either side of £50. Those milk producers conscious of new rules with regards to selling calves under 8 weeks, should take note of the current trade, calves 8 weeks and over, sold to an average of £142 with an average age of 2m 16d. Be a price maker not a price taker!!

All classes good to sell alt-00 hough the handy weights are particularly well sought after. Heavy hoggs short of requirements. Several highlights and long prices throughout the night with MB Townley topping at £157 followed by Kirkby Stephen farmers Messrs Buckle at £154 for Beltex. Kevin Marshall topping at £151 with GR & A Foy selling their best to £150. Plenty of better bred hoggs 300p+ topping at 348.9p again from M Townley with a great consignment of 50 hoggs from JR Metcalfe, Thirsk to 346.4p. Commercial export hoggs 270p-290p. Hoggs weighing 45-50kg £120-£130 with a few better butcher sorts £130-£150.More Cheviots now coming forward off turnips, those weighing 36kg-42kg 280-293p with a pen of 45kg from L Broster, Huddersfield to £119 with locals Mason & Gardner following at £118.50.
