Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): Demand outstripping supply in the dairy ring, with all new calved heifers averaging £1934. Last man in the ring, Steven Lawson took the top honours for the second week in a row, with his two pedigree heifers realising £2180 & £2150. Robert Butterfield at £2120, whilst John Waller and Dick Holden both achieved £2100. Others £1750-£1950. A Fleckvieh heifer from Robert Sunderland looking well sold at £1750. Just a couple of Friesian cows from Mike Livesey topped at £1500 for a third calver.

Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): All classes of calves up a gear, if not two, this week. Black and whites through the roof, the best reared calves to £200+, topping at £235 from Roger Bainbridge, next draw £160-£190, younger sorts £110-£130, with only a very few any less. Beef bred calves with strength in high demand, the strongest Angus bulls peaking at £490 twice, from RJ Holden, Broughton in Furness and J Lawson & Son, Bentham, others from the same homes to £455, £472, £482 & £485. Those a little younger £300-£350 with the smalls just shy of £300. Angus heifers to a high of £295 from Jim & Oliver Parkinson, Woodplumpton, with the majority £230-£270. A shortage of other native calves, a pair of Hereford bulls from John Harrison realised £285 & £295. A total of 24 Blues met plenty of interest— the best of the bulls from the Wallbank Bros of Park House peaking at £600. Smart milky types all £415+, with the smalls in the £300s. It was the Wallbanks leading the way with their heifers at £380 & £450, the other 10 forward, mainly younger and generally £270-£320.

A pair of strong Texel x Cheviot Mule ewes sucking super Beltex x lambs from Michael Dugdale topped the sale making £295 to local buyer Stephen Horner. Frankland Farms also selling a run of quality sheep from £275-£282 whilst singles from Robert Johnson of Harrogate topped at £200. 3 crop Mules with twins from R & EM Cornall of Arkholme sold to £240 with the better end of Mules generally £200+. All classes in demand. Another good entry expected next week.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): As expected, a smaller show of cast sheep with numbers becoming scarce country wide. All classes selling at animated rates with the best and heavy ewes in particular in strong demand and somewhat sharper on the week. Topping this week's sale were Texels from Procters Farm Ltd realising £208 with Jennifer Aiken also selling Texels to £200. Heavy and best ewes in general £150-£190 with the best from Nigel Thorndyke's consignment to £192. Young Ted Dixon of Market Rasen sold Texels to £190 while a consignment from first time vendors GW & MA Platt, Macclesfield sold to £168 to average £154. Good selling lean ewes £100-£130 with small sorts mostly £90+. Heavy Mules £120-£130 with W Harrison of Bentham selling a pen to £134.50. Next draw down £105-£115 with lean sorts £80-£95, all the Mules forward averaging £102.33. The best fleshed Horned ewes selling in the £90s with an odd pen breaking £100. Swales to £112.50 from S & P Parker with Kendal Roughs to £106.50 from Messrs Todd, Sedbergh. Medium sorts £70-£80 with lean types £50+ with a few exceptions. A smaller show of cast rams also on offer. Heaviest CTLs £150-£192 with lean types £110-£130 averaging £138.40 across all breeds. Hill rams to £133.50. B & F Staveley back to top prices this week with a pen of goats to £120.50. Vendors are encouraged to take advantage of the current strong trade with plenty expected in the coming weeks in the run up to Ramadan starting mid April.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): Still plenty of Easter trade with all classes of hoggs in strong demand and meeting with the dearest trade seen so far this season. Plenty of highlights throughout the night's sale including some notable consignments of good fed sheep from the Scottish Borders, Lincolnshire, Penrith and Cheshire. Topping the night's sale at £175.50 were heavy Texels from W Dixon, Cabourne while local young farmer Henry Fawcett of Sedbergh topped per kilo at 468.9p while near neighbour NJ & L Allan, Beck House sold Texels to 400p. Best bred hoggs in strong demand, often 340p-400p or in money terms £150-£170. GW & MA Platt sold their best to 393.9p and 388.9p. Messrs Buckle of Kirkby Stephen to 377p. Commercial export types 290p-320p. A good show of heavy hoggs forward with N Thorndyke leading the way averaging just shy of £160 topping at £173.50. The best from PT & L Johnson sold to £161, NJ & L Allan sold further pens to £172 with ST Birkett, Carnforth to £170.50. A good run of mainly Suffolk x hoggs from Messrs Lamont, Dunslaw sold to £155.50 to average £142.88. Hoggs weighing 45kg-50kg often £135-£150. Heavy Mules £130-£138 topping at £139 again from PT & L Johnson. Handy weights 288p-298p with Messrs Livesey, Lowick Bridge to 300p. Horned hoggs of all qualities good to sell. Swales to £134.50 from JT & J Kelsall, Dales to £137.50 for a marvellous run once again from Messrs Coates while SBF sold to £140 from Hyde Park. Bets sorts in general either side of 300p. Cheviot hoggs to £155.50 from B Dibb and 323.6p from BR Butterfield, Burton. Lightweight horned hoggs 250p-280p depending on quality. Lighter CTLs in strong demand, best 300p-320p topping at 322.1p or £109.50 from L Broster, plainer sorts 260p-280p. A fantastic show of hoggs overall averaging 290.5p or 292.9p SQQ which included 1836 hillbred and lightweights.
