Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): Records were smashed at the Annual Sale of Individual In Lamb Sheep, at Bentham Auction on Saturday, by both Dalesbreds and Herdwicks. John & Jean Bradley, Giggleswick set a new Dalesbred female record of £4000, eclipsing the previous £1700 record set in 2020. The 2shear ewe, with 4 generations of show sheep Champions on the dams side, and sired by the £7,000 John Kelsall, Summerlands tup (66/968) and carrying a single lamb to the £4,000 John Harrison tup (11/2157) headed home with Andrew Bous-

field, County Durham. Oth-

er Dalesbreds saw Michael Carr's 2nd prize ewe realise £2200, which headed back to Giggleswick with John & Jean Bradley. Jean Wilson, Dockray, Penrith was also setting records as her Reserve Champion Herdwick Shearling beat the previous record of £1100, when she was knocked down to Frank Brennand of Chapel-le-Dale, Ingleton at £3000. There was an abundance of interest in all classes of Herdwick's as they brought the day to a close, with Ewes topped at £900, averaging £455 (+£182 on the year), Shearlings averaging £816 (+£399) and Hoggs £206 (+£15). All classes of Blue Faced Leicesters were well bid for, with WA & A Booth, Old Hall, Feizor topping at £3800 with a Mule receip carrying embryos out of J49 Smearsett in lamb to the P18 Smearsett, she was the choice of noted Leicester Breeder, James Taylor, Kendal. Ashley Caton, Skipton, topped the ewe section with his D2 Middleton Hall sired ewe, carrying twins to P1 Gragareth at £1800, bought by a successful telephone bid from Neil Marston of the Highberries flock, Cockermouth. Hoggs and Shearlings both reached highs of £1200, firstly from WM Hutchinson, Kirkby Redgate with their Champion Hogg, she was snapped up by the judge, Graeme Jackson, Bentham, followed by R & PE Hargreaves, with their 1st place shearling being the choice of Will Preece, Roeburndale. The Swaledales, on behalf of the Association, saw 4 figures realised on numerous occasions, the days highlight being, Andrew Skidmore's 2nd prize Gimmer Shearling, sired by High Birkwith Kisdon 1st and carrying a single to Buttrig Viceroy at £1600, staying local with WA & A Booth, Feizor. Others over £1000, include EC Coates of Richmond's Gimmer Hogg at £1400, also being the choice of WA & A Booth. Whilst the Booth Family themselves realised £1000 of their Champion, a shearling sired by the £12,000 Mark Ewbank and in lamb with a single to the £3,000 Brian Thornborrow, she was picked out by young breeder Henry Harrison, Higher Watson House, Keasden. Also at £1000 was KG Sowerby with their 2nd prize ewe, heading to the Trough of Bowland with MJ Alpe & Sons.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): A combination of rough weather affecting the Isle of Man wagon making it to Bentham and the season just about drawing to a close, a smaller show of 733 store hoggs were forward. Trade not a penny less with probably one of the dearest trades witnessed this season with plenty of buyers ringside, several leaving empty handed. Without doubt, the highlight of the sale was a consignment of 223 Continental hoggs from Scottish Borders vendor Glen Wilson, Hawthornside topping the day's sale at £142 with others to £136, £130 averaging just short of £120. Stronger and smart bred hoggs £110-£130. TA Teasdale, Cartmel selling their best to £122. A nicer long keep hogg either side of £100 with Texel x Mules from JC Wade, Overton Bush to £107. Weathered and small CTL/ Suffolks around £80. A handful of Mules sold to £100 from GI & M Faraday with the general run £77-£85. A nice pen of 50 Cheviots from M & C Booth, Kentmere sold to £105. Better Swale hoggs £60-£70 with Jack France, Cross Ghyll topping the section at £76. Smaller hill bred and horned hoggs at realisation. Overall sale average £99.64.

Other Continentals to £390 for Limousins from H & A Stephenson. Angus bulls to £400 from weekly vendor John Lawson, Barnfield, others to £380 & £375 from IT Richardson, Catforth. No top end heifers, the best to £285 for a trio from lan Richardson, matched by John & Nicola Young, Jenkin Cragg, who also had a storming Hereford heifer at £345. Many other Native heifers £245-£265. A total of 30 B&W's, the weanlings £160-£200, with M&D Stable and J&N Young at £215 & £225 respectively. Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): Cast sheep numbers starting to tighten, with all classes good to sell. On the whole, a good show of sheep forward with the heavy and best bred ewes the dearest trade seen for some time. Topping the sale at £220 were Texel ewes from Procters Farm with others to £215 and £210. Plenty of other best quality sorts either side of £200. Heavy ewes £130-£160 with good selling ewes often £110-£130. Smarter and lean sorts £80-£100+. Mules in general £110-£120 with the heaviest pens either side of £130 topping at £142 from D & V

Lawson, Oak Bank. Smarter meaty types £100+ with the lean end £80-£90. Heavier horned ewes £100+ with first time vendor Paul Thorp, Halifax selling Woodlands to £108.50 and Lonks from JJ & D Huddleston to £113.50. Best SBF and Swale ewes £85-£95. Medium types £65-£75 and plain often £40+. More rams forward, best CTL and Suffolks £150-£170 topping at £172 for three Charollais from SJ Crane, Ribchester. A cut below £120-£140, plain £80-£100. Hill rams to £116.50 for SBF from East Mains. A nice run of goats from PA & PJ Ormerod, West Marton topped at £123 with the section averaging £101.88. Overall average for all cast sheep sold £110.04.

Best types of all weights good to sell and in high demand with a heavy Beltex from J Garth & Son topping the sale at £220 with Beltex from Procters Farm topping per kilo at 393.9p. Other notable prices per head: RH & MR Ireland £181, JM Andrews £171.50, £170.50, DN & D Capstick £166.50, GH Bell £166 and per kilo: Procters Farm 369.3p, DN & D Capstick 363.3p, Messrs Sayer 362.8p. Best in general 320-360p, commercial sorts 270-290p. Once again, plenty of hoggs 45-50kg making between £120-£135. Heavier Mules £120+ with handy weights 258-267p. Not much quality
