**Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander):** A seasonal show of stirks forward, numbers tighter but no different to this time last year. Both the local and East Yorkshire buyers present keen to secure cattle for the grass. An indifferent show of cattle on the whole, with some good sorts throughout the entry, the best from JM & DE Wood, Horton-in-Ribblesdale at £1110 with a Limousin Heifer. J & E Nuttall, Old Hutton showed a superb run of 57 Charolais and Angus cattle, topping at £1030 with Char Bullocks and £1000 for Charolais Heifers. Better bred and stronger cattle £950+, younger grazing types often £650-£750 with a few lesser cattle being bought for less. Black and whites to a high of £940 for the last cattle through the ring from G & P Middleton, Garsdale, best end in the £600s, with the next bracket £450-£500. Best of the bulls to £960 for a smart 7month old Blue from CR Alderson & Son, Mallerstang.

Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): John Lawson, Sweetings returned to the dairy ring at Bentham with four smashers, his first, a youthful correct 2<sup>nd</sup> calver, packing 45litres, rapidly shot to £2850, heading home with John Lawson, Bank End, Cockerham. Next up, the first of his three heifers, also at £2850, whilst his next 2 realised £2800 & £2750. David Knowles' trio at £2650, £2550 & £2350 whilst returning vendors Jeff Burrow, Thursgill topped at £2450 and John Huddleston at £2320. The top 10 heifers averaged £2466, with the full entry of 16 averaging £2200. 3 cows forward, John Lawson aforementioned 2<sup>nd</sup> calver £2850, whilst Dave Barton & Peter Swindlehurst both realised £2450 of their second calvers.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): A larger show on the week as the seasonal numbers start to increase. Trade just a shade easier although certainly no disaster. Best Texel ewes to £300 with several other best ewes breaking the £200 mark including 4 from J Garth & Son, Birk Knott realising £220. Heavy ewes £160-£180 with a heavy Leicester from J & RE Baines, Sedbergh to £195. Leaner types and smaller meated types £120-£140, plain depending on condition £80-£100+. Heavy Mules ewes to £148.50 from WA & A Booth with plenty of other stronger pens £135-£145. smaller types £120+. Nearly 700 weaned Swale ewes forward. The strongest fleshy sorts still £100+ with ID Kirk topping at £125.50. Smaller fleshy types £80-£90, medium £60-£75 and plain £40+ with some a shade under. Cast rams averaging £160. Heaviest sorts £200+. A pen of 13 goats from PA & PJ Ormerod sold to £118.50.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): Another decent entry of spring lambs with 2563 forward. Trade better than expected with an overall average of 321.3p achieved—some 10-20p dearer than some local auctions. Heavy lambs continue to be the trade of the day with CD Cornthwaite topping at £210 with A Brown, Darwen equalling this price later in the sale. J Hagar of York showed a run of heavy Charollais topping at £197.50 with first time vendor RG Webster, Whams Farm, ScarisbricK selling their best to £186. This week a show was held for Beltex sired lambs with judging in the capable hands of A Atkinson, A pen of five superb lambs from B & AC Barnes took the red rosette later realising £190 or 463.4p. Next from Frankland Farms at 409.8p. Best handy weights 350p+ with J & A Lawson also up there at 397.4p, E & M Townley 382.9p, R & S Wilcock 382.5p. Commercial lambs in general 310-320p. Heavier Suffolk lambs to £175.50 from HJ & JH Ryan, A pen of 46 Suffolk x Mules from NJ & L Allan to £130 or 304.6p for 43kg. Better bred sorts 360-380p. A handful of lightweight Mule lambs sold to £113 or 289.7p from RE & EA Barker.
