Strong CTL and Suffolk lambs in general either side of £100 with better Beltex pens £100+ with several pens £110-£125. A good medium term lamb £85-£90+ with the best longer term lambs £75-£80. Plainer lambs £60+. Mule lambs dearer on the fortnight averaging just short of £80. Nicer pens £82-£85 topping at £86 from BW & M Haygarth, Dent. Smaller sorts £75-£78. Very few Mashams in the entry but good to sell with Ian Tyson, Lupton topping the section at £86.50. Cheviot Mules to £110 for a pen of 25 from WM & E Dugdale, Close House. More hill lambs forward this week- Cheviots to £87 from JR Blades, Richmond with the best Horned lambs to £58 for Rough Fells. Overall, lambs were smaller than the last sale with an average of £82.17 very pleasing considering the keep situation countrywide, particularly in some of the bigger feeding areas.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): With more ewes now on the market country wide, trade took the usual seasonal knock with some types considerably less money. The good selling lean ewes as well as heavy and best bred types definitely the best to sell with the heaviest pens of Mules not taking much harm either. Lightweight and the plain horned ewes of which are forward in much larger numbers the hardest things to cash with these types taking the biggest hit perhaps some £10-£20. Best of the ewes to £188 for Texels with TD, ME & GE Todd, Sedbergh selling a pen of 3 to £174.50. Heaviest ewes £140-£160 with the cut below £110-£130. Grazing ewes still taking some buying with anything decent £85-£95. Heavy Mules to £130 from S Hill, Beaumont Grange with several other pens £120+. Smaller fleshy types often £100+. Half meated types selling in the £80s with plain £70+. No horned ewes over £100 with the best Swales from W & D Lawson, Parr Bank to £83. Best in general selling in the £70s with medium sorts £50+. Plain ewes £25-£40 with some at realisation. Any being bought to graze certainly easier to sell if they have been clipped. Just 30 cast rams in the entry with plenty of trade. Several selling either side of £200 with lesser goods £120-£140. Topping the night's sale at £260 with heavy Texel from Firm of G Gray.
