

Beef bred cows up to 191p for a British Blue x from David Cockett, Ingleton.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): A good show of cattle forward for the March sale with trade similar on the month, the usual busy ringside of customers in attendance including a few additional faces from Cheshire, East Yorkshire and the North East, plenty of pens of cattle in forward condition with trade generally £1600-£1900 with longer term feeding sorts £1300-£1500. The best of the bulling heifers nicely sought after which included the annual consignment from J & I Whitaker, Bowsber topping the sale at £2100 with others to £2000 and close behind a pure Limousin from W & NL Baines to £1980. A strong demand for B + Ws with new customers ringside. Topping the section was a pair from TD Inman to £1490 with TH Atkins' consignment of 50 to a top of £1270.

Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): An absolute flyer in the calf ring, no let up in the trade for the best calves, Charolais bulls to £505 from The Duncan Family, Mewith. Blue Bulls to £475 & £455 from Andrew Booth, Slated House. Best of the heifers to £445 for Charrys again from The Duncans. Best of the Angus bulls to £415 twice, firstly from John Lawson, Bentham and Mike Packham, Kendal. Younger calves up a notch, a run of 4-5week old Simmentals from Cote Farm Partnership, Nether Kellet to £400 for Bulls and £375 (x2), £370 and £355 (x2) for heifers to average £361. Dairy bulls to £160 from R & E Butterfield, other reared calves £115-£130 with the milky sorts £70-£92.

Auctioneer's Report (Will Alexander): A much better day with the ewes and lambs, a full contingent of buyers were offered a tremendous entry of sheep — reportedly one of the best entries across the Northern markets so far this season. Ian Johnson, Bedale, headed up the top prices with a Texel ewe and a strong pair of lambs at £335, singles to £300 or £150 a life from the same home. Michael and Elaine Dugdale's first consignment of the year kicked the sale off to a flying start, their best to £325 or £108 for a pair of Suffolk Ewes and twins. Their best singles to £260 for a Texel with a cracking Beltex Lamb. Plenty of other pens from the home £300-£315 for twins and £215-£245 for singles. Best twins would regularly be £300+, Henry Fawcett, Ireby at £325 for a Texel ewe with Twins, James Lawson, Parr Bank at £320 for a pair of Suffolks, Laura Eaton and Chris Slinger achieving £310 of their best Texel Ewe. Mule ewes from James and Deborah Ogden sold to a high of £250 for ewes sucking twins, the main of the Mules generally being buyable £74-£78 a life. Numbers growing every week, with towards 100 outfits already entered for next week.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): Like elsewhere in the country, another large entry of cast sheep forward. Trade just under a little pressure with the edge just off slightly although all in all still a pleasing trade. Topping the sale was local producer of quality stock Carol Parker, Reebys Farm with a Texel ewe realising £310. Again the best £200-£260 with the heavy cross bred sorts £140-£180. Good sellers £110-£130 with lighter weight fleshy ewes £80-£100. Mules to £133.50 from RE Hewerdine, Louth with trade for best pens generally £120-£130 and a size below £105-£115. Smaller and leaner pens £80+. Plenty of horned and other hill breeds making up the entry including a pen of 53 Welsh ewes from MW & M Skidmore, Wynyard to £84.50. Best horned ewes generally £85-£100 with a medium type ewe £60-£70 and plain £40+. A plainer show of cast rams topped at £255 for Texels.

Auctioneer's Report (Greg MacDougall): Just shy of 6000 prime hoggs forward and what a trade from start to finish with an overall average 360.4p achieved, a staggering 127.6p per kilo up on the year. Plenty of highlights throughout the sale and plenty of long prices too including the night's top price of £232 for a pen of 17 Texels from SP Woolhouse & Sons, Rotherham. Next up at £225 was T Hill & R Wright with locals Adam Brown and the Oldfield brothers topping their consignments at £220. Best per kilo came from a great run from D Stainthorpe with a pen of 21 Beltex to 489.4p (£208). In this week's sale, 155 hoggs sold for £200 and above with 402 hoggs selling from £190+. Leading averages included T Hill & R Wright £199.12, SP Woolhouse £193.43, W Dixon £187.79, CR Brittain £187.12, W Oldfield £187.10 and J Bowling £187.27. Best bred handy weights generally 400p+ with the extreme sorts 450p+. Best commercials 380p with a first cross hogg 360-370p. Heavy butcher hoggs saw plenty, as previously stated, around £200 with any amounts of the commercial end £180-£190 with medium sorts £170+. Mules to £177 from JA & F Nutter with MW & M Skidmore best per kilo at 354.4p with trade for handier weights generally 340p and heavier sorts £160+. Over 500 horned hoggs with best 340-350p and half meat-

ed types 310-330p. D & V Lawson topping per head with Swales at £160 with L Broster's pen of SBF to £156.50. Best meated light weights and more fashionable stores also in strong demand with a consignment from the Isle of Man to 402.7p.
